

If accumulating points allows us to achieve our goals then it is all for the better. I know that our activities are currently geared toward these SAR goals so let's keep up the good work and have another real good year.

School Program Action



Jenny Geimeier McClurg has been the lead teacher and instructor regarding our school programs. Several Chapter members are also present to do their assigned parts. In the accompanying photo the assistants are staying out of her way while she teaches a class at St. Joseph Elementary, in Crescent Springs. Our school programs have been developed for grades 2-3, 4-5, middle school, special Revolutionary / Colonial Days, Salt Fests /outdoor events, Flag History presentations, Veterans Day, and Patriots' Day. Jenny has a large inventory of materials she has developed or purchased for the hands on approach and visuals. We also have various History Day Programs and Genealogical Seminars available. Donald Drewry and his wife Esther are also very active and have numerous programs that they schedule in the Northern Kentucky schools.

Service to Veterans at the Roudebush VA Medical Center

The Simon Kenton Chapter has made regular deliveries to the Roudebush Medical Center, in Indianapolis, since being assigned that site in 2009. We have sent over \$40,000 worth of items in the past two years alone. Our collaboration with the Boone County Libraries has also allowed us to start a library there with more than 4000 books delivered. (hardbacks, softbacks, tapes and CD) If you know of an organization, school, or church that is collecting items for veterans we would be happy to assist and pick them up for delivery.

The VA Medical Centers are very appreciative of any personal care and comfort items that can be provided in bulk. Personal care items are basically hygiene articles. (soap, toothpaste, toothbrushes, deodorant, etc) Personal comfort items include: cards, puzzles, CDs, DVDs, coffee, etc. The VA Centers also like books and magazines. Simon Kenton has a collaborative effort with the Boone County Libraries to handle that need. There are also homeless vets who find clothing, small appliances and kitchen ware at these Centers. The sample sizes of personal care products are actually preferred.

National Congress 2015 – Louisville



Chuck Scott, pictured left, is serving as the Chairman of the Kentucky Society's efforts, for hosting the National Congress, in July of 2015 Kentucky typically hosts the SAR Congress every seven to eight years because the National Headquarters are located in Louisville. 2013 will be in Kansas City, Missouri; 2014 in Greenville, North Carolina; 2015 in Louisville, Kentucky; 2016 in Boston, Massachusetts; and 2017 in Tennessee. The host Society or State has a number of responsibilities, which requires numerous volunteers to insure success. Chuck has wasted no time in organizing his strategy and laying a solid foundation.

Responsibilities include deciding on the logo; designing the lapel pin; coin and medal set; hospitality room; registration and credentials; memorial church service, transportation needs, ambassadors; ladies and other local tours, banquet decorations; and several more areas. The National handles the finances and the logistics, contracts, etc. The site of the Congress will be at the Galt House on Main Street.


